I am pleased to be able to inform you that the planning for this year's annual conference is well in hand. The conference will take place in York from Thursday 15th to Saturday 17th April 2010. We have booked the Marriott Hotel for accommodation and the Thursday and Saturday programmes. The Friday programme will take place at the National STEM Centre also in York. We have kept the conference fee at last year's price for early payment discount for those of you coming to the full conference and able to pay with your application before the 1st March. We hope many of you will be able to take full advantage.

The York Marriott is a 4 Star luxury hotel with FREE car parking and recently refurbished public areas and restaurant. It overlooks the racecourse and is a short drive from the city walls. It is easily accessed by car or within a short taxi ride from the railway station. Leisure facilities include an indoor swimming pool, sauna, whirlpool, air conditioned gym and a beauty spa.
