



### **National STEM Centre Teacher Associates**

The National STEM Centre officially opened in July 2010 on the University of York campus.

One of the Centre's key objectives is to build the UK's largest open collection of STEM teaching and learning resources. Teachers already have access to the physical collections, and materials will begin to be made available online during 2010.

Alongside contemporary teaching and learning materials, such as print, multimedia, and practical resources, the Centre will hold an archive showcasing curriculum development over several decades.

**We would like to recruit teachers from across the 5-19 age range to work with us in shaping the Centre's collections.** This will involve:

- visiting the National STEM Centre at York for one or two days at a time (this could be during or outside of term time);
- advising on available resource materials;
- researching collection lists for subject specific collections;
- writing reviews of teaching resources held in the eLibrary.

Payment will be made for this work, either to yourself or to cover supply costs if you visit the Centre during term-time. Accommodation and travel expenses will be provided when you visit York.

This opportunity may appeal particularly to colleagues who:

- have a strong interest in curriculum resource development, perhaps as part of their own professional development;
- would find it useful to review resources available for a particular area of the curriculum, and / or key stage.
